What Is Chant?

Remember that the term “chant” can refer to any sung music in the church. Traditional chant comes in a great variety of styles, from the simple repetitive litanies (like the “Lord, have mercy”, or *Kyrie eleison* or the “Litany of the Saints”) to longer and more complicated works employing the melismatic style (in which many notes are sung for each syllable of the text). Chant can also be composed for a prose text as well as a metered text.

Chant, in use since ancient times, was used in the temple at Jerusalem, (for information on contemporary use of music in the synagogue see : <http://www.myjewishlearning.com/article/synagogue-music/#>) and is still used in the Western and Eastern Rite Catholic Churches, as well as the Greek and Russian Orthodox Churches. In the sixth century, Saint Pope Gregory the Great had the chants of the Church organized. Since then, the Roman Catholic Church has often referred to this traditional chant as “Gregorian.” (For more on this see: <http://www.newadvent.org/cathen/06779a.htm>).

We find in our liturgical resource *Breaking Bread* that for each Sunday (and each day of the week) there is an Entrance Antiphon and a Communion Antiphon. There is also the Offertory Antiphon (not in the *Breaking Bread*) although, unfortunately, no official English translation of it exists. The texts of the antiphons and the optional psalm verses that may be sung with them are “proper” to that day. This means that they reflect in a specific way the themes of that day or that season.

For example, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of Mary, celebrates the fact that Mary was conceived without the stain of original sin. The beautiful text of the entrance antiphon for that day (Isaiah 61:10) reflects upon the gift of God to Mary of her spotless soul. It reads: *I rejoice heartily in the Lord, in my God is the joy of my soul; for he has clothed me with a robe of salvation, and wrapped me in a mantle of justice, like a bride adorned with her jewels.*

This text of Isaiah also stylistically prefigures the *Magnificat* of Mary (“My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord...”) It would be difficult to find a hymn or song to match its beauty and precision, but it can be chanted without changing its form.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Parents who wish to have a child baptized should contact Rev. Joseph Giroux to make arrangements for the date and for a program of preparation. Parents are highly encouraged to make arrangements at least three months before the child is born, as the Catholic Church encourages Baptism for infants as soon as possible after birth. Adults and older children (seven years or older) interested in Baptism or entering into full communion with the Catholic Church should inquire about the program of preparation (R.C.I.A.: the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults).

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

A Catholic wishing to be married in one of our churches should contact one of the priests at least six months prior to the desired date in order to begin making arrangements. A program of preparation is required. The parish should be contacted before any other plans are made—for example, the wedding reception.

SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK

For those preparing for surgery, nursing home residents, or the homebound, contact one of the parish priests to make arrangements to be anointed. For those in the hospital (especially in the event of an emergency), ask the hospital staff to contact the priest on call.
