FROM FR. JOE...

Many thanks for all your prayers while I was away on retreat! No doubt, they are a big part of why it was a week filled with so much grace. Know that you were remembered in my prayers then, too—as you are every day.

I'm sure most of you have heard that Pope Francis has declared a special Jubilee Year—a **Holy Year of Mercy**—from December 8, 2015, until November 20, 2016. To mark the start of this special year of grace, we're going to bring together two of the most well-received spiritual exercises we've had in the parish in recent years: Forty Hours Eucharistic Devotions and The Light is ON for You (all day confessions). Adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament will begin at noon on Sunday, December 6, and continue (with breaks at night and a special schedule of prayers and Mass) until an evening Mass and Eucharistic procession on Tuesday, December 8. On Monday, December 7, priests will be continuously available to hear confessions from 6:00am until 10:00pm. (This will be taking the place of our usual Advent Penance Service—which has seen a steady decline in attendanceand will be the occasion of the First Penance of our youngsters preparing for First Holy Communion in the spring.) You should also know that Bishop LaValley has designated one of our churches—Notre Dame—as one of the pilgrimage sites for the Diocese of Ogdensburg where the faithful can obtain the Jubilee indulgence during the Holy Year. More detailed information will be coming your way very soon.

I also want to bring you up-to-date on the purchase and future of the Malone Adult Center. We had the closing on October 26, so the property now belongs to the parish. Our maintenance staff has been in there as time allows ever since, doing some clean up and salvage work. I say "salvage" because it's quite clear (and we were rather sure of this even before we bought the place) that the best thing to do it take down the building. It was certainly quite a grand structure in its day, but it would be very costly to bring it back now. Unfortunately, demolition will be fairly costly, too, since pre-purchase testing proved that there is asbestos in the building. We are soliciting bids and looking at all of our options to see what can be done legally, safely, and affordably.

You know what this coming Thursday is, and as our nation pauses to give thanks to God, so do I: grateful to count you and all you do in for our parish among my many blessings. To you and yours, a very happy Thanksgiving!

Why don't we sing the entrance and Communion antiphons?

Chant (in the narrow sense), though it was given pride of place in the documents of Vatican II, was retained and implemented by few. Many parishes went to a "four hymn format," replacing the entrance, offertory, and Communion antiphons with hymns and adding a closing hymn (not indicated in the Roman Missal) to accompany the movement of the priest and liturgical ministers out of the church.

With the promulgation of the *Roman Missal, Third Edition,* a renewed emphasis has been placed on singing the antiphons in the Roman Missal. Many cathedrals and parishes are taking up the challenge to use these antiphons thereby enriching the musical expression of the celebration of the Holy Mass. The cycle of antiphons is a yearly one—not a three year cycle as with the Scripture readings, so the antiphons need be learned only once.

St. André Bessette Parish is now organizing a men's "schola" (choral group) that will be singing some of the antiphons during the Church seasons of Advent and Lent as well as on the Feast of Christ the King, at the 10:00 p.m. Christmas Eve Mass, and on Easter Sunday morning. The schola will sing only at the 11:00am Masses at Notre Dame Church. The chants will augment, not replace, the singing we already do.

For example, on the feast of Christ the King the assembly will sing two verses of "Crown Him with Many Crowns" as Father and the liturgical ministers process into church. The schola will chant the entrance antiphon and verses while Father incenses the altar. The chants the schola will be using are new ones using the original Latin melodies but skillfully adapted into English by Rev. Samuel F. Weber. They are particularly beautiful. We hope that the implementation of the schola will indeed add solemnity and beauty to the celebration of the Mass.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Parents who wish to have a child baptized should contact Rev. Joseph Giroux to make arrangements for the date and for a program of preparation. Parents are highly encouraged to make arrangements at least three months before the child is born, as the Catholic Church encourages Baptism for infants as soon as possible after birth. Adults and older children (seven years or older) interested in Baptism or entering into full communion with the Catholic Church should inquire about the program of preparation (R.C.I.A.: the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults).

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

A Catholic wishing to be married in one of our churches should contact one of the priests at least six months prior to the desired date in order to begin making arrangements. A program of preparation is required. The parish should be contacted before any other plans are made—for example, the wedding reception.

SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK

For those preparing for surgery, nursing home residents, or the homebound, contact one of the parish priests to make arrangements to be anointed. For those in the hospital (especially in the event of an emergency), ask the hospital staff to contact the priest on call.
