**A LETTER FROM OUR BISHOP**

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

Our focused attention to our families continues this Jubilee Year of Mercy. God's tender mercy and marital love are always signs of hope for tomorrow. Today we see many dark, ominous clouds on the horizon. Yet, Pope Francis insists: "The joy of love experienced by families is also the joy of the Church...the Christian proclamation on the family is good news indeed." The Pope sees that "the desire to marry and form a family remains vibrant, especially among young people, and this is an inspiration to the Church." (*The Joy of Love*, #1)

Marriage + Family = Good News! Married couples today face many challenges to building a strong family. However, the Pope warns us that, in the face of such challenges, "We should not be trapped into wasting our energy in doleful laments" (#57). Instead, we need to offer a word of truth and hope, even if that means calling spouses to heroic action.

That word of truth and hope is offered every year at this time as the Church observes **National NFP Awareness Week**. This week we highlight the anniversary of the papal encyclical, *Humanae Vitae*, which articulates Catholic beliefs about human sexuality, conjugal love and responsible parenthood. Natural Family Planning (*NFP*) is about giving oneself freely, totally, faithfully, and fruitfully to another person in marriage. To many, such a commitment seems nearly impossible today. To make oneself totally vulnerable, to sacrifice for the love of another is the heroism of the marital vocation. Such a self-less witness for life is a tangible sign of hope.

This simple, natural and effective means of understanding a couple's fertility goes beyond the decision to avoid or achieve pregnancy. Married couples who utilize Natural Family Planning have found a new depth of intimacy and understanding. Their communication as a couple grows, building a deeper level of trust, commitment, and fidelity.

In their pastoral letter, *Marriage: Love and Life in the Divine Plan*, the U.S. Bishops write that "God's plan for marriage is a firm foundation, a truthful guide, a trustworthy light for the way." So, we continue to preach the truth about marriage and responsible parenthood, even if today, it seems to many that Christ's teaching on marriage is outdated. Still, it remains a trustworthy light for our world, darkened by sin and self-gratification, by fostering faithful and life-giving spousal love.

Over recent years many in the law enforcement community have shared with me that they believe citizens don't care about or appreciate the work they do. To put it bluntly, that people don't seem to care whether they are safe or not, or even if they live or die. While that might be true in some places, I do not believe for a moment that is true here. If you are among the many who appreciate and care about our Cops, let's show them a little appreciation.

These men and women from our communities, our brothers and sisters, leave their families each day needing to put on a bullet proof vest just to protect us. They accept the harsh reality that they might not go home at night. They are not looking for a party or to be stroked, just to know they are appreciated. I think a "thank you" now and then goes a long way!

What can you do? First thing to do is to pray for law enforcement every day. In addition, perhaps send a card or letter to the Sheriff, Village Police Chief or the local Captain of the numerous State Police agencies serving in your area. Tell the officers that the work they do is important to you and that you pray for their safety. Perhaps send in a care package of snacks for the briefing room or have your kids make a card. It does not really matter what you do as long as it is something.

The recent tragedies are a stark reminder of the risks our police accept for us. We are kept safe by a "Thin Blue Line" of men and women sworn to protect and serve us. May those who have been killed in the line of duty not have died in vain.



**SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM**

Parents who wish to have a child baptized should contact Rev. Joseph Giroux to make arrangements for the date and for a program of preparation. Parents are highly encouraged to make arrangements at least three months before the child is born, as the Catholic Church encourages Baptism for infants as soon as possible after birth. Adults and older children (seven years or older) interested in Baptism or entering into full communion with the Catholic Church should inquire about the program of preparation (R.C.I.A.: the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults).

**SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY**

A Catholic wishing to be married in one of our churches should contact one of the priests at least six months prior to the desired date in order to begin making arrangements. A program of preparation is required. The parish should be contacted before any other plans are made—for example, the wedding reception.

**SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK**

For those preparing for surgery, nursing home residents, or the homebound, contact one of the parish priests to make arrangements to be anointed. For those in the hospital (especially in the event of an emergency), ask the hospital staff to contact the priest on call.
