#### **From Fr. Joe...**

We have two buses of parishioners (and a few assorted cars, as well) heading to Montréal next Sunday for our **parish pilgrimage to St. Joseph's Oratory**. When we last went (June 1, 2014), it was a day of great grace for our whole parish family, and I have every reason to expect the same to be true this time. For those not joining us on pilgrimage, please take note of the abbreviated **Mass schedule next Sunday** and make your plans to attend Mass accordingly.

Many of you have no doubt been wondering, *What's the status of the Pastoral Plan for St. André's?* Back in late March, I shared with you all a "state of the union" message and that the Pastoral Council, having taken into account all the input we've received from you since November, had voted to move forward with the plan pretty much as it was presented to you in a draft last fall. We had hoped to take a final vote in late April. Unfortunately, as has happened before, we hit a snag when we received a note from the diocesan Living Stones Planning Committee in early April that raised a few doubts in our minds, and the special April meeting was canceled. I made an appointment at the end of last month to personally speak with Bishop LaValley about our plan, and also invited Dr. Bill Amoriell, a member of the Living Stones Planning Committee, to speak with the Pastoral Council at its regular last Monday evening. In light of those two helpful conversations, I believe any confusion has been cleared up and we're now ready again to move forward. The Pastoral Council has scheduled a special meeting for Monday, June 26, at 6:30pm at Frassati House (St. John Bosco rectory), during which we expect to review and take a final vote on the completed plan to be forwarded to Bishop LaValley.

Such a plan is always a living document, because a parish is a living institution. While important goals remain steady, how you hope to achieve them must be constantly adjusted as a result of trial and error, changing circumstances, availability of personnel/resources, etc. And because the work of the Church doesn't come to a stop while you're making future plans, some of what we're planning on the pastoral side of things is already moving ahead—changes in our program for K-8 Christian Formation, for example (which you'll be hearing more about in the near future). One of our greatest challenges here at St. André's is getting our parish structure (including buildings and finances) in line with all the good things we need to do to become a more unified, vibrant Catholic community. At its meeting last Monday, the Pastoral Council reviewed the 2017-2018 parish budget, which projects a deficit of over \$165,000—excluding any major repairs or expenses; in the current fiscal year, we're already behind by over \$156,000. No one of us would run our household or our business with such consistent, significant losses...and we certainly can't afford to do so as a parish, either. (Our savings are now under \$300,000.) We all know that change is difficult, but when we face the hard facts, I think we can all also see that change—and significant change—is absolutely essential if we hope to remain not just alive, but effective for generations to come.



**SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM**

Parents who wish to have a child baptized should contact Rev. Joseph Giroux to make arrangements for the date and for a program of preparation. Parents are highly encouraged to make arrangements at least three months before the child is born, as the Catholic Church encourages Baptism for infants as soon as possible after birth. Adults and older children (seven years or older) interested in Baptism or entering into full communion with the Catholic Church should inquire about the program of preparation (R.C.I.A.: the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults).

**SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY**

A Catholic wishing to be married in one of our churches should contact one of the priests at least six months prior to the desired date in order to begin making arrangements. A program of preparation is required. The parish should be contacted before any other plans are made—for example, the wedding reception.

**SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK**

For those preparing for surgery, nursing home residents, or the homebound, contact one of the parish priests to make arrangements to be anointed. For those in the hospital (especially in the event of an emergency), ask the hospital staff to contact the priest on call.
