Any early birds out there? **Our men's group, André's Brothers**, has been gathering on Tuesday evenings for Vespers and faith studies since last January (along with occasional social get togethers, like the cookout a couple of Sundays ago). But I know there are some other men who are interested in taking part, it's just that evenings are bad for them—or Tuesdays in particular (e.g. because of men's golf league during the summer). So I thought we might try an alternative. In addition to the regular Tuesday gatherings, I'm offering to meet with a small group of men before work (say, at 6:00am) on Mondays for prayer and a faith study. It's an approach that has worked in some other parishes, and I thought it was worth a try here, too. We'd meet for between an hour and an hour and a quarter, and the start time could be adjusted depending on the needs of the guys involved. Bringing your breakfast along would be welcome (and coffee might even be encouraged). I've already got three men who are seriously interested, but I thought it was worth asking to see if there were 2 or 3 more out there. It'd be a great way to start your day! **TWENTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME
Is 56:1, 6-7/Rom 11:13-15, 29-32/Mt 15:21-28**

Are you amazed by the Canaanite woman in today's gospel? Her faith, her willingness to follow behind Jesus, calling out to him, making a spectacle and nuisance of herself that the apostles want to send her away. She continues to plead, even when Jesus tries to dissuade her ("I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel."). Even when Jesus seemingly insults her (it is not right to take food of the children and throw it to the dogs), she persists. Did she see Jesus statement as a challenge? Was there something in his eyes that made her persist? She does not get angry, but continues to plead her daughter's case. What great faith and what great humility! What is it you pray for? Can we pray with the same intensity as the Canaanite women for those who have drifted away from the Church and are in need of healing and mercy?

ENVIRONMENTAL STEWARDSHIP

Water supplies used to be relatively constant, but now in many places demand exceeds the sustainable supply, with dramatic consequences in the short and long term" (Laudato Si # 24). We are very fortunate to live in the North East. This summer has been very wet for most; however, farmers are still feeling the effects of the drought last summer. Being more conscious of water consumption such as taking shorter showers, shutting off the water while you brush your teeth, and using gray water (water collected from shower, washing dishes, etc.) to flush your toilets will conserve water. The earth is covered by nearly 70 percent of water, however only 2.5 percent of it is fresh and only 1 percent of our fresh water is accessible, much of it is trapped in glaciers and snowfields.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Parents who wish to have a child baptized should contact Rev. Joseph Giroux to make arrangements for the date and for a program of preparation. Parents are highly encouraged to make arrangements at least three months before the child is born, as the Catholic Church encourages Baptism for infants as soon as possible after birth. Adults and older children (seven years or older) interested in Baptism or entering into full communion with the Catholic Church should inquire about the program of preparation (R.C.I.A.: the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults).

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

A Catholic wishing to be married in one of our churches should contact one of the priests at least six months prior to the desired date in order to begin making arrangements. A program of preparation is required. The parish should be contacted before any other plans are made—for example, the wedding reception.

SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK

For those preparing for surgery, nursing home residents, or the homebound, contact one of the parish priests to make arrangements to be anointed. For those in the hospital (especially in the event of an emergency), ask the hospital staff to contact the priest on call.
