## A FAMILY OF Faith

Our program is off to a great start with over 40 families already registered!

- (1) **You can still register!** Even if you missed the September Parent Meeting, we can still bring you up to speed and get your family started. Forms are available in church and on the parish website. Sign up right away!
- (2) **What about First Communion and Confirmation?** If you have a child that you would like to receive one of these Sacraments in the spring of either 2018 or 2019, then your family should enroll in the A Family of Faith program now (for 2017-2018). First Communion is celebrated with children in 2nd grade and older (which means they should begin preparing as 1st graders), and Confirmation is celebrated with young people in 7th grade and older (which means they should begin preparing as 6th graders). 

**LETTER FROM OUR BISHOP**

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

In honor of the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the apparitions of Our Lady of Fatima and in supplication for our Lady's intercession for the Diocese of Ogdensburg, I will consecrate our Diocese of Ogdensburg to the Immaculate Heart of Mary on Sunday, October 22, at St. Mary's Cathedral.

The message of Fatima remains relevant to our times. It warns of the great calamities that befall humanity when we turn away from Jesus. The message makes promises of peace and joy beginning in this life and perfected in the next if humanity will only give its heart to its beloved Lord. The message of Fatima is one of great hope in the midst of the world's seemingly hopeless turmoil because our Blessed Mother assures us that the Lord is anxious to provide the graces we so desperately need.

"Confirmed in this hope," Pope Francis declared this May, "we... give thanks for the countless graces bestowed over these past hundred years. All of them passed beneath the mantle of light that Our Lady has spread over the four corners of the earth..." The Holy Father continues, "Dear Pilgrims, we have a mother. Cling to her like children we live in the hope that rests in Jesus."

This is my prayer for all the people of the North Country: *Cling to Mary. Hope in Jesus.* May the consecration of our Diocese help us all to live as faithful children of our Heavenly Mother! We will offer Mass in honor of Our Lady at 2:30 PM on Sunday, October 22 at the Cathedral. Before Mass, at 2:00 PM, we will gather in our cathedral for a time of special prayer and reflection as we pray the Rosary together.

To help us prepare for this holy event, I ask all the faithful of our Diocese to join me in praying a Novena during the nine days from the anniversary date of the last Fatima vision, October 13<sup>th</sup> to the day of Consecration on October 22<sup>nd</sup>. More information concerning the Novena and special Marian Mass will be sent to the parishes in the coming weeks.

What a wonderful way to celebrate the 65<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Dedication of our Cathedral, dedicated to our Blessed Lady! Please mark your calendar today and join me and many of our neighbors and friends for the Rosary and Mass as I consecrate our beloved Diocese to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. In the meantime, please continue to join me in responding to her request that we pray the Rosary for peace and make sacrifices for sinners.

## **Our Pastoral Plan..& Your Part In It (Part III)**

As you know, as part of a process involving the entire Diocese of Ogdensburg, our Pastoral Council approved a *Pastoral Plan for St. André's Parish* at the end of June and submitted it to Bishop LaValley. It is currently under review by the diocesan Living Stones Planning Committee, which will then make a recommendation to our Bishop. The complete plan is still available on the parish website and in print at the parish office.

Most noteworthy among the parts of the plan is the proposal to make Notre Dame Church the primary worship site of the parish (with the hopes of eventually building a new parish center nearby), to maintain St. Helen's as a regular worship site as long as we have two priests, to close St. John Bosco Church and repurpose it as a multi-use community center, and to close and sell St. Joseph's Church. It is a radical plan, but was developed with a lot of careful thought and prayer in a process that began in January 2016.

The plan was drafted fully aware that many folks who attended **St. John Bosco Church** often felt unwelcomed in the other Malone parishes after their parish was formed in 1935. That is why, even if it were no longer seemed practical to maintain a second (or third) large worship site in the village, it is important that the parish maintain an active presence in that neighborhood. In our current set up, the only regular church activities on site each week are Sunday Mass and Thursday Bingo; if this plan is enacted, there will be church sponsored activity 5-6 days a week on the premises. Converting space in the facility to expand our food pantry and thrift store, and opening up the possibility of having room for parish nursing and outreach to women in crisis pregnancies, would allow us to better help our neighbors address the needs of their bodies, so they can then put some attention into the care of their souls.

The plan to keep **St. Helen's Church** open as a worship site was influenced by the fact this rural portion parish has already closed three mission churches —alienating some our remote parishioners. Folks who live in Lake Titus, Owls Head, or Mountain View are already driving 10 miles or more just to get to Mass in Chasm Falls, leave alone to do so in the village, and there are no other Catholic churches reasonably accessible to them. Nonetheless, if staff is reduced to one priest, Mass would at most be offered seasonably at St. Helen's or the church would be designated an oratory.

While the Pastoral Council worked very hard to listen to your concerns and craft the best plan it possibly could, we know that the plan is not perfect and cannot please everyone. **It is also important to realize that the work of planning never really ends as long as a parish exists...which means your input and perspective are always welcome and needed!** Please continue to pass along your feedback and comments on the *Pastoral Plan for St. André's Parish* and on parish life to any member of the parish staff or Pastoral Council. The Council is scheduled to next meet on Monday, September 18.
