From Fr. Joe...

Thanks to all who took part in **the final Sunday Mass at St. John Bosco Church**. It was quite sad, but also quite beautiful. Bishop LaValley's homily for the occasion was from the heart and spoke to the heart; I'm including a copy in your bulletin this Sunday so we can all reflect on his words.

The final Mass at St. Joseph's Church, scheduled for May 1, has been canceled. Bishop LaValley received a formal petition from an individual parishioner here in Malone, speaking to harm potentially caused by his decree to close the church; it was received on April 16—which, according to the timeline set out in Canon Law, was the last possible day for such a petition to be filed. Therefore, Bishop's decree concerning St. Joseph's has been suspended; Canon Law provides for up to 30 days to allow time for him to try to address the concerns of that parishioner, and so avoid a possibly lengthy appeals process. These laws are in place to make sure that the rights of all affected souls are respected and protected. Bishop is hoping that things can be worked out in the next few weeks. As always, I will keep you posted...

By now, you've most likely heard some talk about **the possible closure of Holy Family School at the end of the current academic year**. That possibility is being considered, but (at the time this bulletin goes to print) no final determination has yet been made. Please keep the whole "family" of Holy Family in your prayers at this challenging time.

Low gluten hosts are available at each of our churches. If you or a loved one require a low gluten host for medical reasons, please see the priest *at least 5 minutes before Mass* to make arrangements for Holy Communion.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Parents who wish to have a child baptized should contact Rev. Joseph Giroux to make arrangements for the date and for a program of preparation. Parents are highly encouraged to make arrangements at least three months before the child is born, as the Catholic Church encourages Baptism for infants as soon as possible after birth. Adults and older children (seven years or older) interested in Baptism or entering into full communion with the Catholic Church should inquire about the program of preparation (R.C.I.A.: the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults).

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

A Catholic wishing to be married in one of our churches should contact one of the priests at least six months prior to the desired date in order to begin making arrangements. A program of preparation is required. The parish should be contacted before any other plans are made—for example, the wedding reception.

SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK

For those preparing for surgery, nursing home residents, or the homebound, contact one of the parish priests to make arrangements to be anointed. For those in the hospital (especially in the event of an emergency), ask the hospital staff to contact the priest on call.
