Responding to Abuse

This week, the Diocese of Ogdensburg released its report detailing the outcome of the Independent Reconciliation and Compensation Program or "IRCP." The IRCP is part of an on-going effort to express contrition to those who suffered sexual abuse by diocesan clergy and to help them find healing. This report outlines the IRCP's progress, including the number of victims and accused abusers and compensation distributed. It also reviews the lessons learned in the process and summarizes our Safe Environment program and how allegations of misconduct are handled today. HOLY FAMILY SCHOOL

Low gluten hosts are available at each of our churches. If you or a loved one require a low gluten host for medical reasons, please see the priest *at least 5 minutes before Mass* to make arrangements for Holy Communion.



"I was sick, and you visited for me" (Mt 25:36) Did you know that about 50 of our parishioners currently receive Holy Communion regularly at home because they're unable to join us at Mass? (This is in addition to those who are in the hospital, nursing home, or other senior residences.) We have a dedicated core of volunteers who make Communion calls to the homebound...but **we are in need of some more**. It means so much to our sick and elderly members to be visited by someone from their Church! And it's quite rewarding, as well. If you're interested in helping with this important ministry, please call the parish office. Training will be provided.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Parents who wish to have a child baptized should contact Rev. Joseph Giroux to make arrangements for the date and for a program of preparation. Parents are highly encouraged to make arrangements at least three months before the child is born, as the Catholic Church encourages Baptism for infants as soon as possible after birth. Adults and older children (seven years or older) interested in Baptism or entering into full communion with the Catholic Church should inquire about the program of preparation (R.C.I.A.: the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults).

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

A Catholic wishing to be married in one of our churches should contact one of the priests at least six months prior to the desired date in order to begin making arrangements. A program of preparation is required. The parish should be contacted before any other plans are made—for example, the wedding reception.

SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK

For those preparing for surgery, nursing home residents, or the homebound, contact one of the parish priests to make arrangements to be anointed. For those in the hospital (especially in the event of an emergency), ask the hospital staff to contact the priest on call.
